Transcription of obituary published in the Minutes of Conference

WILLIAM MOORE: born at Cowden, East Yorkshire, in 1866. He entered the Primitive Methodist Ministry in 1891, and served with marked ability and devotion in many circuits. After ten years at Filey, he retired in 1929.

Studious in temperament, his knowledge of Greek and French literature and his ordered reading enriched his pulpit ministry. As a Supernumerary he continued to preach frequently and acceptably. He was a good preacher and visitor, welcome in the homes of the people. As administrator he was wise and capable. He filled a distinguished place in the life of Filey and neighbourhood for twenty-five years: (the last fifteen as Supernumerary).

A most friendly man, he exercised a wholesome influence wherever he went, and he was always loyal to those Christian principles which he preached. He was called to higher service on 27th December 1944, in the seventy-ninth year of his age.
