
Robert Crisp

Transcription of obituary published in the Primitive Methodist Magazine

Mr. Robert Crisp passed to the Homeland on October 20th, 1918. Born at East Rudham, February 27th, 1846, he attended the Primitive Methodist Sunday-school. Removing to Sheffield, he became a member of Stanley Street Church and an active worker in the Sunday-school. When he came to live at Attercliffe Common he at once joined our Bethel church, then in the Stanley Street Circuit, and has been a loyal member and official for forty years.

He took pride in being a man of principle. A Sunday-school teacher, and leader of one of the largest and most successful classes in the circuit, he was also circuit steward for the last seventeen years, and was also connected with many social and religious movements outside our Church.

He had been in failing health for about two years. During his sickness he found that God was his refuge and strength. The interment took place on October 25th at Burngrave Cemetery.
