

Thomas Allen

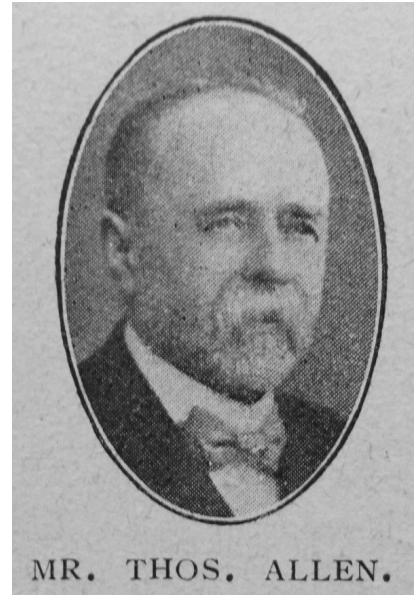
Transcription of obituary published in the Primitive Methodist Magazine by J.T. Riddiough

Mr. Thomas Allen was born at Bradford in 1850, and passed away on September 5th, 1917. In early days he lived at Bingley, and there he was "born again." Later on at Shipley, and then for thirty years at Manningham, he manifested sincere attachment to the Church of God. He was in membership for over fifty years, and for twenty-eight years he was, superintendent in our Manningham school.

His friendly concern followed those who were called to the War, and "when the lads come home" many will miss him. He held office as class-leader, trustee and circuit steward, and faithfully responded to the calls of his position.

He knew the cause at Manningham when financial difficulties menaced it, and was ever generous in both gifts and service. His trust in his Saviour was deep and full, and it failed not.

The remains were interred in Nab Wood Cemetery, Shipley, the ministers officiating being the Revs. W.H. Matthews, G.A. Lucas, and H. Taylor. The Rev. F.E. Heape, an old friend, made the journey from Bridlington to be present.
