

Thomas Greenhow

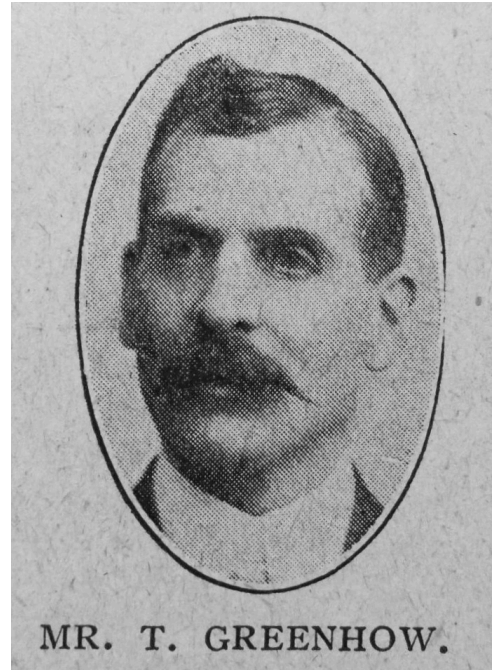
Transcription of obituary published in the Primitive Methodist Magazine by George Davies

Mr. Thomas Greenhow came of a godly stock, both his father, and mother being lifelong members of our Church. For an unbroken period of seventeen years he was circuit steward on the Maryport Circuit. There is no department of our Maryport Church in which he did not spend his talent and strength.

As Sunday-school teacher and superintendent, temperance worker and trust secretary, he was always most regular and painstaking. Zealous for the spiritual and financial welfare of the Church, and enthusiastic in politics, his departure is a great loss to the community as well as to the Church.

The end came with startling suddenness. For some months he had not been well. An operation for some internal malady was found necessary, but was unsuccessful. He passed away on April 12th, 1919, at the age of fifty-five. We can hardly realise that he is no longer here. We still expect to see his well-known figure walking briskly down the aisle, and to hear his familiar voice. His death is a heavy blow for our Maryport Church.
