

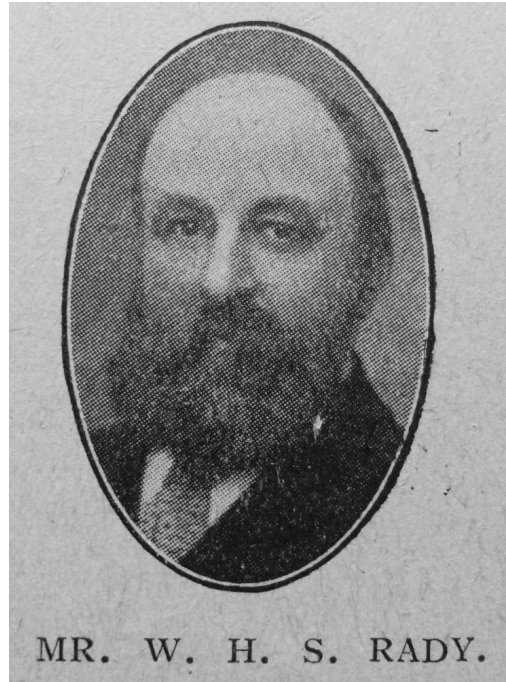
William Henry Simons Rady

Transcription of obituary published in the Primitive Methodist Magazine by J.T. Giles

The Liskeard Church has suffered a great loss by the translation of Mr. W.H.S. Rady, on June 25th, 1918. For forty-three years he was a faithful member of our Church, a trustee, society and circuit steward. The Sunday school, however, held the highest place in his affections.

He was one of the oldest Oddfellows in the town, having joined the Lodge in 1871, and passing through all the chairs with credit. His sterling worth was recognised by his employers, father and son, by valuable presents at the end of twenty-five and fifty years' faithful service..

There was a large attendance at his funeral. The resident minister, the Rev. W. Neil, paid fitting tribute to his character and service. He was a loving father, a tender husband and a true friend. The Rev. W. Neil also preached at the memorial service, taking as his text, Psalm xxxvii. 37.
