
John Whoon

Transcription of obituary published in the Primitive Methodist Magazine by T.L. Page

A native of Poole, John Whoon came to Chacewater about thirty-five years ago as a railway worker. He early became converted and joined the Primitive Methodist Society, since when he has been connected with the Sunday School and for many years was senior superintendent. He was also society steward and chapel secretary. For long he served very faithfully as circuit steward, but had to relinquish the office two years ago because of failing health. A very able and popular local preacher, as well as a most devoted class leader, he witnessed many conversions and was very powerful in prayer.

During months of affliction, he was cheerful, hopeful and bore his sufferings with Christian fortitude. He died as he had lived, in the true faith of the gospel, on Easter Monday afternoon, March 24th, 1913. He was buried on the following Friday. The service was conducted in Chacewater Chapel by Rev. T. Lloyd Page, assisted by Mr. J. Tredinnech. Brother Whoon leaves a widow to mourn his loss.
