

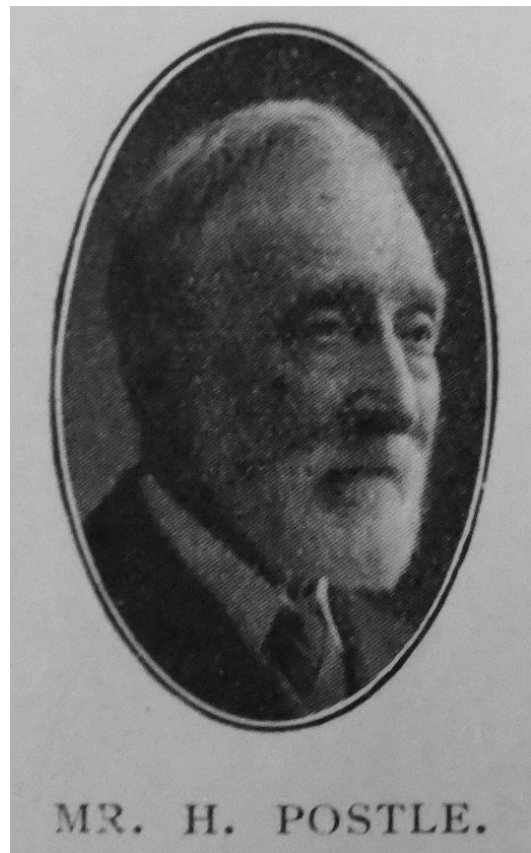

Transcription of obituary published in the Primitive Methodist Magazine by J.H.B.

In the passing of our brother to the higher service on December 3rd there has gone from our midst a veteran of London Primitive Methodism. Born at Burgh in Norfolk eighty-seven years ago, he was converted in a cottage prayer meeting at the age of seventeen. Soon after his conversion he became a class leader and local preacher, and for nigh upon seventy years he occupied these two offices in addition to other duties which he performed from time to time.

Coming to London in 1852, he joined the Kennington society. As a worker he was most devoted and earnest. There was a firmness in his faith, a magnificence in the mellowness of his life, an inspiration in the intensity of his character, and it should be said that he was a pattern of humility.

The funeral took place on December 9th, and a memorial service was held on December 21st.
