

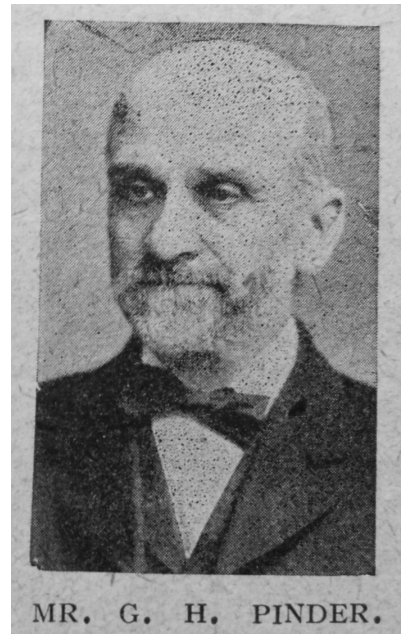
## George Henry Pinder

### Transcription of obituary published in the Primitive Methodist Magazine by E. Lacey

Dewsbury Road Society, Ossett, has been impoverished by the death of its oldest official, Mr. G. H. Pinder. He was one of the most characteristic men in local Primitive Methodism. His personality was talented and complex. His disposition contained that grace that placed him among the burden-bearers.
