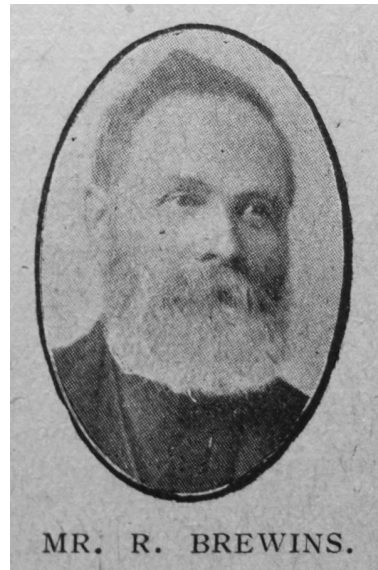


Robert Brewins

Transcription of obituary published in the Primitive Methodist Magazine by F. Winterburn

Mr. Robert Brewins, who for over forty years was society steward and class-leader at Selby, passed to his reward on September 18th, in his eighty-first year. He was born at Rawcliffe, in a Wesleyan family; but, on coming to Selby about fifty-two years ago, he became associated with our Church. He was highly esteemed for his integrity, industry and truth.

For many years he was choirmaster. He preached on occasion, though not a local preacher. Above all he was a class-leader, and one of the most successful. The duties of any office he held were faithfully and punctually discharged for the love of God. He was a very devout man. Religion was a vital part of his life. He delighted in God's work and worship, and talked religion as well as lived it. Much valuable work did he achieve in the visitation of the sick.



On September 21st the mortal remains of our friend were laid aside in Selby cemetery. The service was conducted in our church by the circuit minister. Mr. Brewins leaves a widow and one-son, Mr. J.M. Brewins, the devoted circuit steward of the Selby Circuit.
