Ata them age of sixty, on November 16th, our brother breathed his last at Riccall. His last illness was long and wearying, yet he was ever patient and resigned. He was interred in Riccall Churchyard November 18th, the service being conducted by Rev. A.J. Bull and Mr. D.S. Blair. A memorial service was conducted by Rev. A.J. Bull on December 1st.
