

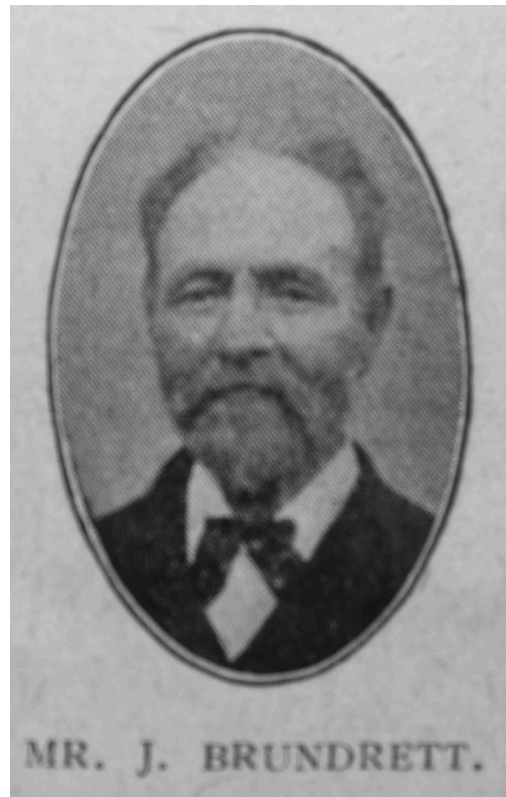
John Brundrett

No man was better known, or more truly esteemed, than Mr. John Brundrett, of our Ashton-on-Mersey Church, in the Manchester V. Circuit. He lived amongst the people with such Christian grace and courtesy that when he died the whole village mourned as members of one family.

For forty-five years he was a most devoted and successful class leader, and during the same extended period he fulfilled the duties of Sunday school teacher with remarkable efficiency. With rare diligence and untiring zeal he served the interests of the Church as society steward for thirty-five years. He was a trustee both of the old and the new church, ever loyal, ever generous, ever faithful, The young people loved him as a father, the troubled found in him a friend indeed, and the sick and dying were ministered unto by him with rare sympathy, while his prayers proved to such benedictions rich and priceless.

He passed with startling suddenness, but he was fully prepared and entered with joy into the presence of his Lord. "The memory, of the just is blessed."
