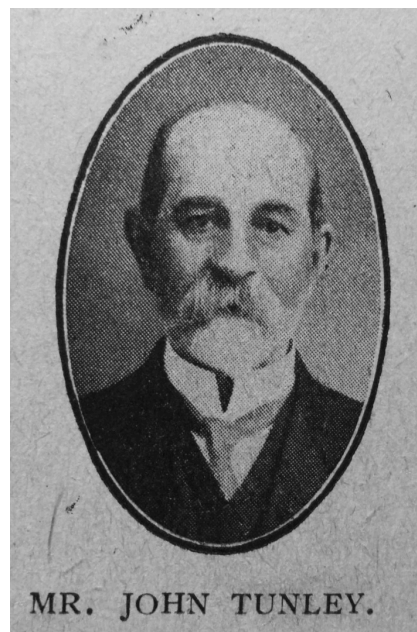


John Tunley

Transcription of obituary published in the Primitive Methodist Magazine by P. Nume

John Tunley walked life's dusty way more than seventy years, and he walked with God. By his industry, skill and integrity, he won for himself a good position in the commercial life of Liverpool. He possessed strong convictions, and his convictions possessed him.

From his early youth his membership in our Church was unbroken. As Trust Treasurer, Class-leader, local preacher, and Circuit Steward in connection with Liverpool II. Station he abounded in good works. His religious experience was clear and triumphant, and he could give a reason concerning the hope that was in him. He loved the class meeting, the prayer meeting, and the public services of the sanctuary. His place was rarely empty. By his words and actions, John Tunley demonstrated the power of God's grace. In the presence of a large number of friends, his body was interred at Anfield Cemetery on October 1st, 1918. The Revs. P. Nume and G. Armitage officiated at the funeral, and the latter gave an appropriate address.
