
William Hall Dunn

Transcription of obituary published in the Primitive Methodist Magazine by G. Armstrong

William H. Dunn was born in South Shields, March 21st, 1844, lived all his life in his native town, and died there on June 11th, 1913. Trained in a Christian home, he gave himself to church work from his youth, being a teacher and secretary of the Old Glebe Sunday School. Converted at Hough Street Chapel, he soon became a local preacher. A diligent student, he had an alert intellect, put conscience into his preparation and was welcomed in all the pulpits of the circuit. He took a keen interest in the training of local preachers, and was for many years the secretary of the Circuit Training Committee.

The thoroughness which was always so manifest in his religious life and work was also in constant evidence in his secular calling. He built up a considerable plumbing business, and established a reputation throughout the town and district for honest and conscientious work.



He was a loyal and devoted Primitive Methodist, putting the interests of the church first, and generously supporting all her institutions. Full of cheer, he was always happy in doing kindly acts, and delighted in giving a helping hand to all good causes.

He was interred on June 14th in Harton Cemetery amid every mark of respect. He rests from his labours and his works do follow him.
