**And** it appearing that the endowment of the Charity consists of the above-  
mentioned Chapel, with the appurtenances, comprised in the above-mentioned  
Indenture :

**And** after due notice of the intention to make this Order published according  
to the direction of the Board by being affixed to or near a principal outer door of  
the said Chapel on the 9th December 1929 (being more than one calendar month  
before the date hereof) :

And having received no notice of any objection to the proposed Order or suggestion for the variation thereof :

**Do hereby Order** as follows :—

1. The said

JOSEPH BARLOW,

is, in accordance with his own desire, removed from being a Trustee of the Charity in so far as he is a Trustee thereof :

HENRY MURFIN, of Alexandra Road, Winshill, Grocer ; and

THOMAS LUTHER DICKEN, of No. 181 Branstone Road, Burton on Trent, Polisher and Cabinet Maker ; all in the County of Stafford ; and in so far as they are not already Trustees, the said

THOMAS SMITH, and

HUGO CHARLES SPENCER ;

are appointed to be Trustees for the administration of the Charity, in addition to, and jointly with, the said

WILLIAM POTT,

the continuing Trustee thereof :

3. The said Chapel, with the appurtenances, shall forthwith vest in the persons who by virtue hereof are constituted the Trustees of the Charity for all the estate and interest therein belonging to or held in trust for the Charity :

4. The subjoined Scheme is approved and established as the Scheme for the regulation of the Charity.

## SCHEME.

The above-mentioned Chapel, with the appurtenances, shall be held henceforth by the Trustees thereof upon such and the same trusts, and to and for such and the same ends and purposes, and with, under, and subject to such and the same powers, provisos, declarations and agreements (so far as the same may be applicable and capable of taking effect) as are expressed, declared and contained in and by a certain Indenture dated 24th March 1864, being the Trust Deed for the settlement of a Chapel at Walworth, in the County of Surrey, and usually known or distinguished as "The Methodist Chapel Model Deed"; but so nevertheless that the said premises shall (save as hereinafter provided) be held subject to the restriction following, viz., that it shall not be lawful for the Trustees (notwithstanding anything in the said Model Deed contained) to make or grant otherwise than with the express authority of Parliament, or with the previous sanction of the Charity Commissioners or of a Court of competent jurisdiction, any sale, exchange, mortgage, or charge thereof, or any lease thereof in reversion after more than 3 years of any existing term, or for any term of life, or in consideration wholly or in part of any fine, or for any term of years exceeding 21 years.

Provided that the aforesaid restriction shall not apply so long as the said Chapel is registered as a place of meeting for religious worship with the Registrar-General of Births, Deaths and Marriages in England, and is bonâ fide used as a place of meeting for religious worship.
