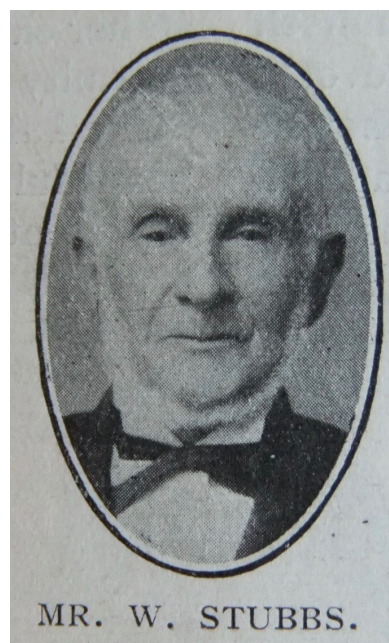


William Stubbs

Transcription of Obituary In the Primitive Methodist Magazine

Brother William Stubbs, of Edleston Road, Crewe, who passed away December 5th, 1911, was born April 6th, 1824, in the parish of Weston, near Crewe. In 1837, at thirteen years of age, he was converted at a Camp Meeting conducted by the Venerable Hugh Bourne. He at once joined Weston Society. In 1840 his work as a Local Preacher — which extended over seventy years was begun. In 1847 he removed to Crewe, and he at once joined our Church in Market Street. Appointed a Class Leader, his class soon numbered 54 members. In 1861 he, with Bro. James Glover, commenced a mission at the Mill Street end of the town, which prospered exceedingly. After several attacks of illness, on December 5th he passed peacefully away. The interment took place on December 8th at the General Cemetery, Crewe. This was preceded by a service held in the Mill Street Church (of which our brother was the founder), conducted by the Revs. G.T.D. Pidsley, C. Finlay, W.B. Cheshire, R.W. Roberts (Presbyterian), and Alderman McNeill. On Sunday, Dec. 17th, a memorial service was conducted by the writer.
