Primitive Methodist Chapel Grane-road Haslingden.

The Primitive Methodist Chapel in Grane-road, Haslingden, was erected in 1880 at a cost of £6,200, during the ministry of Rev, E. Newcume. This was a very great undertaking for the hundred members who formed the church, and great fears were felt, when, after the opening services were completed, it was found that £4,000, mentioned as a debt. But with a sacrifice and zeal that have known no abatement for twenty years, the Church set about the reduction of the debt. Steadily year by year, the burden was lessened, until eighteen months ago it stood at £1,050. Then it was thought possible to clear this off entirely. By a years united and enthusiastic toil this was accomplished. The spiritual work however was not neglected, the membership increasing from 100 to 180, and if there is not another increase after the meetings of last week-end it will not be the fault of the workers for Primitive Methodism in Haslingden.
